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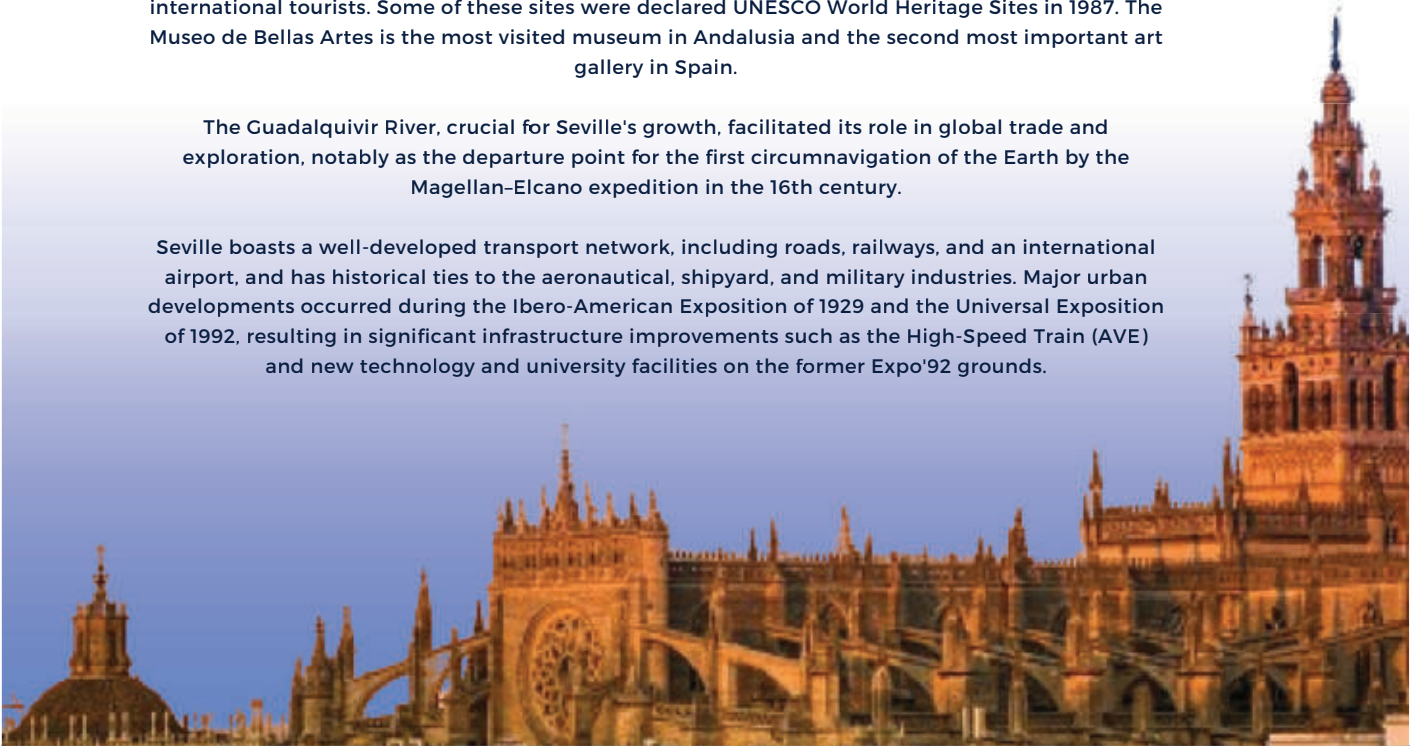
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1. INTRODUCTION

Seville is one of Europe's most beautiful and ancient cities, featuring one of the largest historic centers. Its rich historical and monumental heritage, including landmarks like La Giralda, La Catedral, El Alcázar, El Archivo de Indias, and La Torre del Oro, attracts both national and international tourists. Some of these sites were declared UNESCO World Heritage Sites in 1987. The Museo de Bellas Artes is the most visited museum in Andalusia and the second most important art gallery in Spain.

The Guadalquivir River, crucial for Seville's growth, facilitated its role in global trade and exploration, notably as the departure point for the first circumnavigation of the Earth by the Magellan-Elcano expedition in the 16th century.

Seville boasts a well-developed transport network, including roads, railways, and an international airport, and has historical ties to the aeronautical, shipyard, and military industries. Major urban developments occurred during the Ibero-American Exposition of 1929 and the Universal Exposition of 1992, resulting in significant infrastructure improvements such as the High-Speed Train (AVE) and new technology and university facilities on the former Expo'92 grounds.



2. VENUE FOR THE CONFERENCE

CaixaForum has been chosen as the venue for the conference.

CaixaForum Sevilla is a building designed by Sevillian architect Guillermo Vázquez Consuegra, inaugurated in 2017 at Puerta Triana, a space that unites the center of Seville, the modern Isla de la Cartuja, and the popular Triana neighborhood. It is a cutting-edge Cultural Center, a landmark of the city.

It has a strategic location and easy access by urban bus, taxi, private car or even taking a walk.



3. TRANSPORTATION

Transportation from the airport to the city

We have several options to get from the airport to Seville:

Rent a car from any of the rental companies available at the airport.

Taxi: There is a flat rate which on weekdays from 7 am to 9 pm would be 28 euros, and from 9 pm to 7 am would be 30 euros, including weekends. Taxis are available at the taxi stand outside the arrival's terminal.

Bus: There is a public bus, Line EA, that operates from the airport to the city and makes several stops:

Special Airport Line EA: Seville-Seville Airport

City line (Airport Special) that connects the airport with the city center. It operates during the day, 365 days a year.

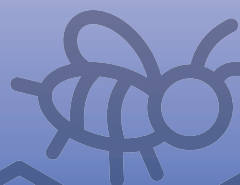


Frequency and Schedule:

- The first departure from Plaza de Armas to the airport is at 4:30 a.m.
- The last bus from the airport to Seville departs at 01:00 a.m.
- The journey usually takes 35 minutes from the airport to the city center.
- Terminal on the ground floor, arrivals side.
- Round trip.
- Single ticket: 5 €. Round trip (same day): 6€. Tickets sold on the bus.

To Caixa Forum

- By bus: Ask at the hotel reception for the bus stop) Ticket 1.40€ You can buy your ticket on the bus by paying in cash.
- By taxi: You can ask for one at the hotel reception or call one of these numbers 0034 954 622 222; 0034 954 580 000

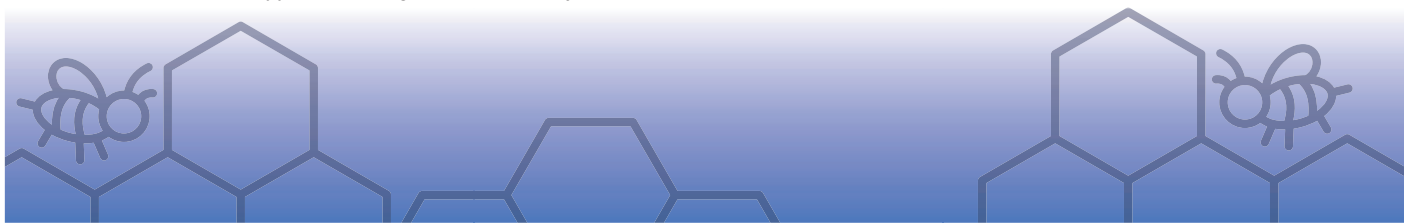


4. HOTEL OPTIONS

- Route: The tour will start at Plaza de España, then continue strolling towards Jardines de Murillo, Barrio de Santa Cruz, around the Alcázar and the Cathedral, Ayuntamiento, Avenida Constitución, Puerta de Jerez, and end at Casa Guardiola for a wonderful dinner.

Casa Guardiola (1880) is a notable example of Sevillian regionalist architecture, blending 19th-century eclecticism with elements that would later define Sevillian regionalism, which gained prominence during the 1929 Expo. Commissioned by Andrés Parladé y Sánchez de Quirós, Count of Aguiar, a painter, politician, and archaeologist, the house embodies his artistic and historical interests, featuring a columned patio and artifacts like the cross of the Inquisition. Constructed with high-quality materials, including imported woods and marbles, it showcases both modern and traditional elements.

After the Count's death, his widow sold the house to Doña María Luisa Domínguez and her husband, Don Salvador Guardiola Fantoni. Their family of 15 moved in, and today, the house is managed by their descendants. It has been renovated to host events, complete with modern amenities like updated bathrooms, a catering area, and a soundproof dance room, while retaining its historical charm with period furnishings.

Located in Seville's historic center, Casa Guardiola is easily accessible by public transportation, making it a prime venue for various events.
